


Approximate Location Of Albert County's Covered Bridges



[1] BAMFORD COLPITTS COVERED BRIDGE

On Private Property Spans Little River on Colpitts Farm Rd. off Rte. 895 in Colpitts Settlement.

Built in 1943

100' in length

Construction: Single Span Burr Truss Variation

[2] WILLIAM MITTON COVERED BRIDGE

Not in service.

Spans Turtle Creek on the Mitton Farm Road just off Route 112 between Riverview and Salisbury.

Built in 1942

76' in length

Construction: Single Span Burr Truss Variation

[3] PETER JONAH COVERED BRIDGE

Not in service.
Spans a man made pond on Dewey
Road just off Route
910 near Turtle
Creek dam.
Moved to its present location from Jonah
Road in 2013.

[4] HARTLEY STEEVES COVERED BRIDGE

Crosses Weldon Creek on Route 910 in Salem near Hillsborough.

Built in 1923

60' in length

Construction: Single Span Howe Truss

[5] SAWMILL CREEK COVERED BRIDGE

Not in Service

Spans Sawmill Creek alongside Route 114 in Hopewell Hill.

Built 1905

104'6" in length

Construction: Single Span Howe Truss

[6] CROOKED CREEK COVERED BRIDGE

Partial Service.

Spans Crooked Creek on a road that follows the creek inland about six miles from Riverside-Albert.

Built 1945

93' in length

 [7] SHEPODY RIVER COVERED BRIDGE

Spans Shepody River on Midway Road just off Route 114 in Germantown.

Built in 1903

61' in length

Construction: Single Span Howe Truss

[8] FORTY-FIVE RIVER COVERED BRIDGE

Crosses a gorge cut by Forty Five River on a road that also shares the same name. Off Route 114 near Alma.

Built in 1914

94' in length

Construction: Single Span Howe Truss

[9] POINT WOLFE COVERED BRIDGE

Spans Wolfe River inside the Fundy National Park

Built in 1992 to replace original that was destroyed due to a repair mishap.

Construction: Single Span Howe Truss
