


[1] FLUME RIDGE COVERED BRIDGE
(Magaguadavic River #7)

Spans the Magaguadavic River on Mill Road via Flume Ridge Road off of Route 3. Flume Falls is nearby.

(Digdeguash River #6)

Spans the Digdeguash River on the Tyron Road just off Route 127 at Dumbarton.

[5] MAXWELL CROSSING COVERED BRIDGE
(Dennis Stream #3)

Carries Maxwell Crossing Road across Dennis Stream just off Route 3 north of St. Stephen.

Found on Canal Road crossing the Canal that flows between Lake Utopia and the Magaguadavic River.
